There were 6 winners this year. Outside the Box Winner: Sue Boettler offers workshops for parents and teachers seeking help for children with learning disabilities, as well as teaching children to read and spell. Youth Leadership Winner: Nine-year-old Logan Kuhn started his own group to raise money and feed children our community. Behind-the-Scenes Winner: J. Sean Keenan’s leadership helps more people gain fair and equal footing in the justice system with Community Legal Aid. Volunteer of the Year Winner: Hank Kozub was nominated by two organizations and helps out at the Catholic Charities serving Portage and Stark Counties pantry, spends time at the Adult Day Services center and assists at the annual fundraiser. Collaboration of the Year Winner: Stark Tuscarawas Workforce Development Board and United Way of Greater Stark County Board of Directors worked together to create the Financial Prosperity Center at OhioMeansJobs, helping local residents become more financially stable.
