Over 250 guests and staff members were in attendance. Highlights of the morning included recognition of local volunteers, along with awards for area businesses and organizations that went above and beyond to support United Way's Impact BOLD GOALS in Health, Education and Financial Stability.

Results of the 2016 UWGSC fundraising campaign and FY16 audit report were announced and the FY17 budget was presented. 4 outgoing Board members were recognized: Aimee Belden, Sister Carolyn Capuano HM, Richard Kyle and Robert Belden. 3 new members were welcomed: Cindy Hickey, Sandy Rapp and Todd Pugh. The 2016 Campaign Co-Chairs Ted and Scott Swaldo were recognized, and they thanked the staff, volunteers and generous donors for helping UWGSC raise over \$6.3 million. It was announced that the co-chairs of the 2017 Campaign are Linda & Kevin Smith. The DeHoff Emerging Philanthropist Award for 2017 was presented to Joel Daniel Harris and the 2017 Gold Key Service Awards were presented to Helen Syrios and Mary Beddell.

Keynote Speaker was Chris Thompson, collaboration consultant and director of regional engagement from The Fund for Our Economic Future. Chris spoke about the essential elements of collaboration and how to leverage these functions locally.
